**TRICK
OR
TREAT**

By the late 1940s, **TRICK OR TREAT** was firmly established as an American custom. and the emphasis in trick-or-treating was clearly shifting: fewer tricks, more treats!! Kids ringing a stranger's doorbell in the early days received all sorts of tribute: **coins, nuts, fruit, cookies, cakes, popcorn balls and toys** were as likely as candy.. Treats were mostly homespun in the 1940s, but by the 1950s food manufacturers and retailers were figuring out ways to cash in with commercial foods. Local retail stores were the first to emphasize Halloween candy. M&Ms, Snickers, Baby Ruths and Butterfingers were the first. **What are your memories of Halloween in the 40's?**

Ernie started farming by

He was at a dance in Hamburg when he met his wife to be. They dated for about two years and were married at the Lutheran Country Church by Green Isle! Her maiden name was **Deloris Bruch**, part German and Russian. They had 3 children. **Bruce** is the oldest. He’s married to Patty and they live out in the country by Cleveland. They have four children! Bruce works in Le Center at a coffee factory and Patty works for an insurance company in Minneapolis. Ernie and Delores’s second child was also a boy, **Wayne**! He’s married to Helen and farms close to Le Center! Helen works for a dentist office and they have 3 children! Their last child was finally a girl. They named her **Brenda**. Brenda and her husband have 3 children and they live on a farm by Le Center.

Ernie and Delores loved to go dancing and fishing. In their later years they enjoyed traveling to Germany, Austria, Switzerland and the Bahamas!
